Her work there culminated with the opening of a \$274 million sports arena/entertainment venue with an attached hotel and office complex. Ms. Hailstone created and managed the \$234 million of funding needed to bring this complex project to reality. She also supervised a professional staff of 92; oversaw five key City departments—Business Development, Federal Grants Programs, Bureau of Building Standards and Safety, Bureau of Planning and Zoning, and Bureau of Health; and managed a \$7.6 million annual operating budget. She was charged with ensuring the financial prosperity of businesses, entrepreneurial development, nonprofits, housing, and neighborhood groups.</p>
